Tubulin-4A Alpha Chain Polyclonal Antibody

Source: Goat

General description: Goat polyclonal antibody to alpha tubulin. Microtubules of the eukaryotic cytoskeleton perform essential and diverse functions and are composed of a heterodimer of alpha and beta tubulin. The alpha and beta tubulins represent the major components of microtubules, while gamma tubulin plays a critical role in the nucleation of microtubule assembly.

Alternative names: TUBA1, TUBA4A antibody.

Form: Polyclonal antibody supplied as a 200 µl (3 mg/ml) aliquot in PBS, 20% glycerol and 0.05%

Reactivity: Reacts against human, rat, mouse, monkey and canine proteins.

sodium azide. This antibody is epitope-affinity purified from goat antiserum.

Immunogen: Purified recombinant peptide derived from within residues 80 aa to the N-terminus of human alpha tubulin produced in *E. coli*.

Specificity: This antibody gives a positive signal in the following human (HeLa), rat (NRK), mouse (AtT-20), dog (MDCK) whole cell lysates.


