## **Anti-Spike RBD Domain (SARS-CoV-2)**

Source: Goat

**General description:** The spike or S glycoprotein is a transmembrane protein with a molecular weight of about 150 kDa found in the outer portion of the SARS-CoV-2 virus. This protein is composed of two subunits, S1 and S2 and plays a key role in the receptor recognition and cell membrane fusion process. The S1 subunit contains a receptor-binding domain that recognizes and binds to the host receptor angiotensin-converting enzyme 2, while the S2 subunit mediates viral cell membrane fusion.

**Alternative names:** S glycoprotein SARS Coronavirus-2, Spike RBD Domain SARS Coronavirus-2 antibody.

**Form:** ?Polyclonal antibody supplied as a 100  $\mu$ l (3 mg/ml) aliquot in PBS, 20% glycerol and 0.05% sodium azide. This antibody is epitope-affinity purified from goat antiserum.

**Immunogen:** Affinity purified recombinant fusion protein using the spike protein RBD domain (residues 320 to 420) and produced in E. coli.

**Specificity:** In lysates of transfected cells with the plasmid containing the sequence used, detects the fusion protein by Western blot.

**Reactivity:** Reacts with Transfected cells proteins



**Usage:** 

WB: 1:500-1:2,000

**Storage:** For continuous use, store at 2-8 C for one-two days. For extended storage, store in -20 C freezer. Working dilution samples should be discarded if not used within 12 hours.

**Special instructions:** The antibody solution should be gently mixed before use...
